2015 Activity Report

Highlights

- Closed eleven loans totaling \$1,561,783 for projects in seven cities, as follows:
 - -Closed ten Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) loans totaling \$1,503,972 for projects in six cities; and
 - -Closed one State Small Business Credit Initiative (GCF-SSBCI) loan totaling \$57,811 for a project in Avondale Estates.
- Provided nine loan commitments totaling \$2,076,200 for projects in nine cities, as follows:
 - -Provided six RLF loan commitments totaling \$1,386,000 for projects in six cities; and
 - -Provided three GCF-SSBCI loan commitments totaling \$690,200 for projects in three cities.
- Launched the Foundation's Green Communities Fund (GCF2) Energy Rebate program.
- Conducted the fifteenth annual "Heart & Soul of Georgia" Bus Tour May 13-14, 2015, which was repurposed in 2014 into a mobile workshop targeting municipal officials.
- Partnered with the Georgia Municipal Association, the University of Georgia, and others to provide technical
 assistance to communities through the Georgia Downtown Renaissance Partnership.
- Partnered with the Georgia Municipal Association and the University of Georgia's Carl Vinson Institute of Government to conduct four Basic and two Advanced Downtown Development Authority training programs.
- Awarded the Foundation's annual Renaissance Award to Louis Pichulik for his efforts in the revitalization of downtown Decatur and other cities in Georgia.
- Developed the Foundation's first strategic plan.
- On December 8, 2015, the Foundation and the Georgia Municipal Association (GMA), with support from the Georgia Power Foundation, conducted a workshop on the New Community Initiated Development© approach in Suwanee, Georgia. A second workshop is planned during the first quarter of 2016.
- On December 9, 2015, the Foundation and GMA, with support from the Community Foundation for Greater Atlanta, conducted the first Civic Conversations symposium in Decatur, Georgia. These one-day symposiums are designed to help city officials explore important urban issues with peers and partners. Two additional Civic Conversations are planned in 2016.
