# 2018 Activity Report

### **Highlights**

- Closed eight Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) loans totaling \$1,608,250 for projects in the following cities: Albany, Athens, Augusta, Covington, Decatur, Ellijay (2 loans), and Moultrie.
- Provided nine additional loan commitments totaling \$1,949,470 for projects in the following cities: Augusta, Blairsville, Blue Ridge, Hartwell, Lawrenceville, McDonough (2 projects), and Monroe (2 projects).
- Provided six rebates totaling \$180,127 through the Foundation's Green Communities Fund (GCF2) Energy Rebate program.
- Conducted two "Heart & Soul" Downtown Workshops in Dublin on May 16th, and in Newnan on October 3rd.
- Partnered with the Georgia Municipal Association, the University of Georgia, and others to provide technical assistance to seven communities through the Georgia Downtown Renaissance Partnership.
- Partnered with the Georgia Municipal Association and the University of Georgia's Carl Vinson Institute of Government to conduct four Basic and two Advanced Downtown Development Authority training programs.
- Awarded the Foundation's annual Renaissance Award to Paul King, of Augusta, Georgia, for his efforts in the revitalization of downtown Augusta.
- Updated the Foundation's strategic plan for 2018.
- Partnered with the Georgia Municipal Association, the Georgia Department of Community Affairs, the University of Georgia, and Georgia Power to begin developing a proposed Placemaking initiative, tentatively called the Georgia Placemaking Collaborative.
